A FOW member in good standing is eligible to attend any members' meeting. To vote at a members' meeting, a member must be in good standing at least 45 days prior to the meeting.



The Board of Directors (the "Incorporators") has been busy getting FOW up and running. Several Directors assumed extra responsibilities as Officers including President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer and Communication Officer. Key governance documents have been developed including the *By-law* and the *2015-2018 Strategic Plan* both of which are posted for viewing on the FOW website (www.friendsofwabakimi.org).

A Call for Volunteers

2004 -2015

To date, 187 individual volunteers from across North America and Europe have spent 1,027 days on 123 trips exploring the canoe routes in the Wabakimi Area. Together, they have rehabilitated and mapped some 4,682km (2,890 miles) of canoe routes, identified and cleaned 896 campsites and located and cleared 895 existing portage trails measuring a total of 237,078 metres (259,272 yards or 47,140 rods). Congratulations to all for a job well done! Your contributions are very much appreciated!

The Wabakimi Project

2015 witnessed a 12th successful season during which 27 volunteers spent 65 days on reconnaissance expeditions exploring the canoe routes that cross the Arctic/Atlantic Height of Land from Little Caribou and Caribou Lakes into the Big River watershed. Not all routes were completed; the remainder will be explored in 2016 along with those that link Wabakimi Provincial Park to Kopka River and Obonga-Ottertooth Provincial Parks.

2017 will mark the sesquicentennial (150th anniversary) of Canada's Confederation. Hopefully, all of the routes in the Lake Nipigon watershed will be completed by then so Volume Five of our series of map booklets can be released.

Mapping Wabakimi

The Wabakimi Area is the largest contiguous wilderness canoe area in the boreal forest of North America--larger than Woodland Caribou and Quetico Provincial Parks combined or even the province of Prince Edward Island. The Wabakimi Area encompasses some 2,572,734ha (9,934 square miles or 6,357,364 acres) and includes Albany River, Kopka River, Whitesand, Brightsand River and Obonga-Ottertooth Provincial Parks as well as Mojikit and Attwood Conservation Reserves. Within this vast area are some 6,000km canoe routes. To date, 89 maps detailing 4,600km of canoe routes have been published in four booklets. Help is needed to complete the remaining 1,400km!
