60 donors contributed to our successful fundraising for our joint Kiosk project with Wabakimi Provincial Park. We raised \$8,413 CAD! The park has received \$6,500. The rest goes towards the indigenous artwork project, administered by FOW, with an RFP to be issued in 2022.
