




FOW Planning Map & Days Available











# Safety: Specific Gear





# **Entry/Exit Points & Types**

#### Access Points

- Authorized
- Restrictions Apply
  - Kopka Lake Room to Camp. No Parking on the
  - Kopka Bridge -Access before
- bridge on north side. Do not park on bridge. Fast water
- Bukemiga Lake -First Nation families
- camp here, good landing but please do not camp.
- Little Caribou Lake
   Limited Parking best route if windy.
- Caribou Lake Small parking lot poor shelter in
  windy weather.
- Tamarack Lake -Road in poor
- shape, there may be access restrictions
- Kopka River North -Current condition grown in, not
- grown in, not suitable for access beyond Maggotte Lake.

- Sparkling Lake Small landing just
  before bridge. Park
  off the road
- Vista Road -Caution, haul trucks use this road. Limited Parking.
- Pikitigushi River Good Access point,
  room to camp.
- McKinley Road -Restrictions Apply
- Pashkokogan Lake
   Safe Parking may
  be available at local
  lodges
- Smye Lake Cleared area, room
  to park and camp.
- Sassenach Lake -Road to lake is
- grown in, walkable (1200m). Campsite is 200m from main road.
- Maggotte Lake -Good access, can camp along road, limited parking. Road is in poor shape beyond this
- Fitchie Lake Short access road to landing







- By car...
- Road conditions might require high clearance
- May not be safe to park and paddle
- Shuttle services through outfitter/others to your entry point.




- By train...
- 18 drop off points between Armstrong and Savant Lake at popular insertion/extraction points. Rail Access information (gives distance from Armstrong and Waterway access.
- ViaRail for schedules/fares

- Out of Armstrong, Savant Lake, Pickle Lake
- At least \$500+ US per person each way
- Wabakimi Fishing & Canoeing Outfitters (Thunder Bay/Armstrong)
- Wabakimi Air (Mattice Lake Outfitters) (Armstrong)
- Rusty Myers Fly-in Outposts (Savant Lake)
